**Normie**: For being kind and helpful to Aroha and others in the class.


**Paul:** For putting in a great effort in completing work within a given time.

# INVENTIONS...did you know? By Charlotte and Kalika

Did you know that not all inventions were made on purpose? Potato chips and playdoh are three such inventions. Potato chips were first meant as an insult. In 1835, a cranky guest came to the restaurant where George Crum worked. The guest complained that Crum's fried potatoes were too thick, soggy and bland and demanded a new batch. Crum was not used to such insults, so he decided to play a trick on the diner. He sliced the potato super thin, fried it so much that a fork could shatter it and then he purposefully over salted the dish thinking that the guest would hate it. To his great surprise the guest loved it and ordered a second serving. Crum's invention spread quickly and became a hit across New England. Playdoh was invented before World War II when coal was used to heat homes which left horrid soot stains on walls. Noah and Joseph McVicker created a doughy material designed to take away the stain then gas came along and coal was phased out. In the early 1950's the brothers found out that their sister, a school teacher, used the material in her classroom as a modelling dough..playdoh was born!
