## THE RAGGED SCHOOL by Summer

Throughout the time we were at the ragged school, we split into three groups for our trades. For the first session the boys went gold mining and to the steam works, one of the girls groups went to a sewing class and the other girl group went to apothecaries. I was in the apothecaries for the first session, apothecaries is like an old chemist. There were two rooms in one cottage and one of the rooms were for the doctor, the doctor was also a vet, dentist and a midwife. We got told that if the cottage smelt good and clean it meant that you were healthy and well and if it smelt disgusting you would get very sick. If the patient has just visited the doctor and there was something wrong with the patient then Ma'am at the counter would make the tablets on the spot with all the herbs and ingredients for them. By the end of the session we got to make some bath salts. The second time we went to trades, the boys went off to gardening and brought

back a plant. One of the girls groups went to sewing again and the other group went to peg doll making. I learnt that glue was made out of flour and



water back then. We got to decorate our own peg and take it home.
