LIVING SAFELY WITH PETS

On Tuesday the 31st of July we did a lesson about how we can learn to live safely with our pets. We did a lot about dogs and how to treat them. We did how to see their emotions and what they are feeling by their facial expressions and to see how they are feeling at different stages. Diana (the teacher) had a dog named Basil, he was two years old (15 in dog years). When an angry dog approaches: Step one - stand still.

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Step two - hands down beside you. Step three - be as quiet as you can. Step four - look at the ground. A safe way to approach someone else's dog: Step one - walk up slowly and stop. Step two - ask the owner if you can pat their dog.

2018 PARENT OPINION SURVEY
