Science – GEOLOGY (term 4 topic)

We need soil and rock samples!

This term both classes will be exploring the features of soils, rocks and landscapes. We need students to collect soils and rock samples to compare and contrast their features. It would be great if they could bring their samples to school by **Tuesday 24th October**.

Tasks to do...

1. Students collect 1 cup (250 mL) of soil. Preferably this soil is not from a garden bed but from a natural area, such as a lawn, nature strip or paddock. When collecting this soil, students are asked to record the location and attach their notes to the sample. Please include their name and date of collection.
2. Students bring this soil to school, preferably in a transparent screw-top jar that can hold at least 400 mL of water.
3. Students collect different types of rocks. Students are asked not to bring rocks that are too large or heavy, or that might cause harm due to sharp edges. Students are asked to record the location of these rocks and attach their notes to the rock e.g. with tape or a rubber band. Please include their name and date of collection. Thank you!
